Strategy

During the CTE Advisory Council gathering on July 17, 2013, it was agreed to adopt a high-level strategy focused on exploring the employment opportunities for CTE students within NYC government. The largest employer in NYC government, which employs over 300,000 people in almost 70 different agencies.

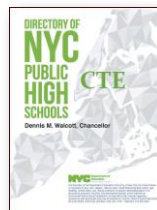
